The 6 Dimensions of Honors Learning

"6 x 6"

are woven throughout the 6 Honors Learning Experiences.



Honors staff facilitate fall seminars that develop the Honors mindset and build community among likeminded students.



Collaborate with an instructor to turn a regular course into an Honors Learning Experience.



Examine topics with an Honors facilitator and other Honors students during short-term, noncredit experiences.



Choose a section that emphasizes a deep exploration of content and includes engaging application of course topics or skills.



Initiate research or independent projects in any discipline under the guidance of a faculty member.



Experience learning by visiting inspirational places beyond campus.

Requirements

Grade Point Average

Eligible Probation Ineligible 3.3+ 3.0-3.29 Below 3.0

Honors Academic Probation

- Students on Honors probation have up to two semesters to raise their cumulative GPA to 3.3 or better.
- While on probation, students must achieve at least a 3.3 semester GPA in order to have a second probation semester.

Honors Participation

Honors students who have classes on campus are required to complete one Honors Learning Experience each semester.

- Honors experiences that are credit-generating may not be taken credit/no credit and must result in a grade of "C" or better.
- Students who complete multiple Honors Learning Experiences in one semester may "bank" one experience to use in a future semester.
- Only one Honors Learning Experience can be "in the bank" at a time.
- Honors Learning Experiences are not required in the summer; however, a summer Honors Learning Experience can be banked if the bank is "empty" or can fulfill the participation requirement for the following fall semester.
- A variety of types of Honors Learning Experiences is encouraged.

When students are completing a semester off campus, they are not required to complete an Honors Learning Experience. Off-campus semesters may include:

- Study abroad
- Student teaching (registered for STT 399)
- Fall semester of Professional Development School Internship
- Field-based semesters for special education (not practicum)
- · Full-time internships
- Full-time clinical rotations (e.g. medical lab science)
