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PREFACE

The seventh annual *Graduate School Data Book* includes a collection of information designed to answer frequently asked questions about Illinois State University's Graduate School. The information is organized in major sections: admissions, enrollment, degrees and graduate certificates, stipends and waivers, and a definitions section. An appendix offers information on the interpretative data used to score reports and an institutional profile from the Survey of Earned Doctorates.

Illinois State University began offering master's degree programs in 1943; doctoral work was introduced in 1962. In Fiscal Year 2006, the University offered 41 master's programs (including the Master of Fine Arts and the Master of Business Administration), seven doctoral programs (Biological Sciences, Curriculum and Instruction, Educational Administration, English Studies, Mathematics Education, School Psychology, and Special Education), a Specialist in School Psychology, and eleven graduate-level certificates. Definitions

Admission Grade Point Average: To be admitted to a master's degree program, a student must have at least a 2.8 grade point average, on a 4 point scale, for the last 60 hours of undergraduate work.

Census Day: The University's official date for enrollment. For ISU it is the first day of class following the 10th day of class in each semester.

Certificates: Illinois State University currently offers three types of certificates at the graduate level:

- **Graduate Certificate:** Requires a minimum of 9 but no more than 17 semester hours of graduate courses beyond the bachelor's degree. This type of certificate is **not** approved/reviewed by the IBHE and are not reported to the IBHE or other external agencies.
- **Post-Baccalaureate Graduate Certificate:** Requires a minimum of 18 semester hours of graduate courses beyond the baccalaureate degree, but less than required for a masters' degree. This type of certificate is approved/reviewed by the IBHE.
- **Post-Master's Graduate Certificate:** Requires a minimum of 24 semester hours of graduate courses beyond the master's degree but less than a doctoral degree. This type of certificate is approved/reviewed by the IBHE.

Degree Program: A program which has specific requirements and number of credits, including a common core for all students seeking a particular degree. Degree programs are approved by the Illinois Board of Higher Education.

Degree Student: A student that has been formally admitted to a program leading to a degree.

End of Term: A file saved after the last day of classes, finals, and grade reporting each semester. Off-campus enrollment is more accurate if counted at the end of term.

Fiscal Year: Includes the summer sessions, fall, and spring semesters. For example, data for fiscal year 2005 includes information for summer 2004, fall 2004, and spring 2005.

Full-Time Student: For graduate students 9 or more credit hours per semester.

Graduate Record Examination (GRE): A national exam used for admission to many master's and all doctoral programs.

General Management Admission Test (GMAT): A test used for admission to the College of Business graduate programs.

Grade Point Average (GPA): The total number of grade points divided by the total graded semester hours attempted.

Graduate Assistants: Students working toward a graduate level degree that are hired by the University to teach, do research, or fill office positions while continuing their education. A Graduate Assistant receives a monthly stipend and may also receive a tuition fellowship.

Graduate Trustees' Tuition Waiver Awards: Are awarded on a competitive basis to students who show promise for success and have not received a fellowship or other award funding tuition costs.

Headcount: The count of each student enrolled at the University.

Major or Program: A cohesive combination of courses, including introductory, intermediate, and advanced course work, that designates a student's primary area of specialization.

Minorities: Includes American Indian/Native Alaskan, Black Non-Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, and Hispanic racial/ethnic designations. Non-Resident Alien is not included as a minority.

New Enrolled Students: Students attending Illinois State University for the first time at that level.

Non-Degree Student: A student who has not been admitted to a program leading toward a degree; these include students-at-large, and students working toward a non-IBHE approved/reviewed graduate certificate.

Non-Resident Alien: International students who are neither a United State's citizen nor United State's permanent residents.

On-and Off-Campus: A student is considered "off-campus" if all of their courses meet at a location other than a University facility; they are considered an "on-campus" student if any or all of their courses meet at a University facility.

Program Level: A classification of programs indicating what type of degree or certification the student will earn.

Semester: A semester at Illinois State is the 16-week academic session offered each fall and spring. The summer session is not considered a semester.

Student-At-Large: a Graduate student who is not currently working toward a degree or has not been officially admitted to a graduate degree program.

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL): an English exam required of international students prior to admission.

Appendix B contains a preliminary analytical writing score distribution. The data are based ONLY on examinees who tested between October 1, 2002 and June 30, 2004 where 56% are women and 40% are men. It is likely the examinees on whom the percentiles were calculated scored higher on the analytical writing section than will be true of the entire GRE population because:

1. examinees who cannot produce good analytical writing essays may have tested before analytical/writing was added to the General Test, and/or
2. examinees who do produce good analytical writing essays may have wanted to test between October and June to show their proficiency in this area on their applications.

One major difference in the October 2002-June 2004 test-taking population is illustrated in the following chart, which shows that for the October 2002-June 2004 time period, U.S. citizens whose primary language is English represent about 67% of the test takers, whereas in a more typical year, they represent only about 57% of the test takers.
